The Friends of La-ba-te-yah is a group of individuals consisting of professional volunteers, neighbors of Crown Hill, and staff of United Indians of All Tribes Foundation working in collaboration on a Master Site Plan for the La-ba-te-yah Youth Home.

We are seeking proposals from qualified consultants with low income green initiatives experience as well as experience working on native American community projects. The term contract is to provide comprehensive professional consulting service to create a La-ba-te-yah Master Site Plan through a community-based process with outreach and education and identifying funds for implementation.

SCOPE OF WORK:

These services may include, but not limited to facilitating the community input, work with the Friends of La-ba-te-yah to develop a preliminary master site plan, develop cost estimates, facilitate community input and research funding sources including a final report. The master plan process is intended to involve the community in determining how the property will best benefit the community we serve and live in.

The intent of the plan is to enhance services and improve the quality of the site to benefit the community with primary focus on youth and elders. It will include collaboration between the urban native and crown hill communities and also agencies servicing people of color. Outcomes for this project will include:

Completion of the preliminary La-ba-te-yah Master Site Plan.

- Identify funds for completion of an Architectural the Master Site Plan.
- Engage community outcome to be measured by attendance at meetings, gatherings and support of the La-ba-te-yah and neighborhood activities.
- Tangible outcomes include maintaining our collaborative partnerships with the local businesses
- Develop and foster collaborative partnerships with the community associations and sharing of resources (services).

A series of methods of evaluation will be included throughout the entire planning process with a final preliminary master plan presented to the Board of Directors for ratification.
